PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Study duration 2 YEARS

September 2025 to June 2027

General objectives

To acquire the skills, know-how and interpersonal skills needed to work as a circus artist. These skills are recognised through the 'Artiste de cirque et du mouvement' (Level 5) certification.

Candidate profile

- The course is designed for people wishing to prepare for the profession of circus artist.
- The course is open to people aged 16 and over, and you must have passed the selection process.
- However, the majority of applicants are aged between 23 and 24, and rarely over 27.
- Younger people are advised to apply for preparatory training.
- This course is accessible to people with disabilities.
 Our establishment's Disability Officer is there to support them.

Audition process

From February to July 2025. The selection process is divided into two parts: the first part is based on applications, the second by auditions. The closing date for applications is the 19th of May 2025.

Graduates

Artists in contemporary circus companies, cabaret artists and events.

Student Status

Students have the title known in France as "stagiaire de la formation professionnelle" with the possibility of receiving remuneration depending on the student's status.

Yearly training costs

The course fees are covered by our public funding partners.


Administrative costs remain payable by students, which amount to €475 + €23 for the FFEC 2025 federal membership. A total of €498.

SKILL SETS

- 1 | Practising circus arts
- 2 | Building a career as a circus artist
- 3 | Development of the creation of a circus artistic project

Programme Overview

- The first year will be devoted to general skills: improving physical conditioning, theoretical input, affirming a circus technique, specific physical preparation and practice of a circus technique, developing artistic potential, improving acrobatic level.
- In the second year, students will be able to refine their technical and artistic development and move towards a circus act or a personal project that will help them find employment.
- Final exam of the certification.









EVALUATIONS

Interim assessments will take place every term for each course, as well as quarterly individual interviews and weekly group meetings in order to monitor the progress of each student.

Certification assessment

This will take place in several stages.

- Completion of a professional dossier at the end of the 2-year course.
- Design and performance of an individual artistic sequence at the end of the course.
- Performance of a collective sequence during the course.
- Performing an Artistic and Cultural Education sequence during the course.

At the end of these exams, a jury made up of the director of the school, the educational manager, a company director, a professional artist and a recognised professional from the sector will validate all or part of the skill-set.



FACILITIES

The Centre Régional des Arts du Cirque PACA is housed in buildings owned by the Communauté d'Agglomération du Pays de Grasse allowing the school to welcome future students in the best possible conditions.

Premises

- A **750 m²** big top fully equipped with all the material needed to learn the circus arts (dynamic acrobatics floor, large trampolines, aerial apparatus, anchored and free-standing wires, Chinese pole, etc.).
- A **200 m²** big top specifically for artistic classes (dance, acting, creation, etc.)
- A classroom.
- A resource centre (books, magazines, video, audio, etc.)
- Cloakrooms/showers.
- Additional building (dance room, dojo, auditorium).













PRACTICAL INFORMATION

The training takes place at Piste d'Azur, on the site of the Espace Culturel et Sportif de la Vallée de la Siagne. Some sessions may be held at our partners' premises (PNSD Rosella-Hightower, etc.).

BY TRAIN

Get off at Cannes (Alpes-Maritimes) station, then take the 662 bus from outside and get off at Le Cros stop (Stade Ferrero). www.zou.maregionsud.fr.

La Roquette-sur-Siagne, then follow signs for the Pégomas
Super U (on the D9).
